Kayla Saville Ecovillage Living in Scotland

Kayla recently had the opportunity to travel abroad in order to visit and experience the Findhorn Foundation, Ecovillage, Spiritual and educational center, in the northern part of Scotland.

In 1962, 3 people moved to a small parcel of land and began gardening to sustain themselves. Working with nature, this small group became famous for the great size of their vegetables would grow, though the land wasn't quite suitable for gardening. In time, the village began to grow and eventually became the foundation it is today. They hold a number of workshop on a variety of topics throughout the year, which attract people from throughout he world. The foundation prides themselves on their communal way of life: eating together, working together, and living sustainably. Kayla has had the pleasure to work in the kitchen and in the garden. The foundation setting promotes mindfulness in all activities pursued, being aware of not only yourself, but others as well.

The Findhorn Foundation integrates permaculture in their projects, training people who attend the workshops on year-round agriculture without depleting the soil's nutrients, while working with the elements. Attendees are also trained on permaculture ethics, which include: earth care, fair share, and people care, which combined allows one to realize that we are all connected. Students are also taught the 5 permaculture attitudes, the problem is the solution, work with nature, not against, everything garden, unlimited yield, and minimum effort for maximum effect

The Findhorn Foundation has built a number of ecological buildings using recycled materials. They also use on-site power generation, a biomass boiler that heats 12 separate buildings, and wind turbines as forms of sustainable energy.

The Nisqually connection: Kayla would like to initiate a similar, sustainable community here in the Nisqually watershed. She and Steve Pruitt, also a member of the Citizens Advisory Council, have been working together to establish the Elthea Spiritual Living Community.
