

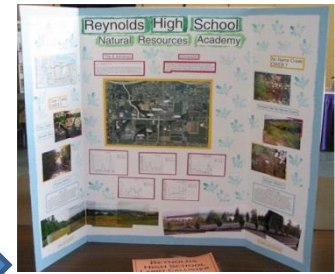
2014 Student GREEN Congress Presentation Ideas

Presentations can vary greatly at Congress. Using the Delegate Note Sheet, students can present their findings in a number of creative ways this year, from paper to electronic presentations.

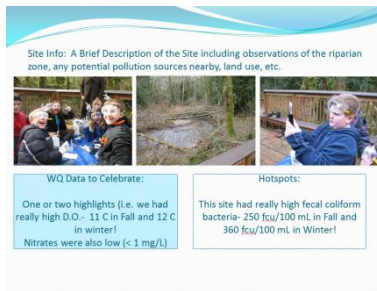
Here are just a few ideas:



Trading cards: You can make trading cards of your monitoring site using this website: <http://www.bighugelabs.com>. Just click on “Trading Cards”, upload your picture and follow the prompts!

Powerpoint: You can also use Microsoft PowerPoint to put together a single slide containing information about your site, or develop a multi-slide presentation if you have the time.
